#### Story Skill: Theme

before or earlier

The author's uses a story's setting, characters, and their actions in each scene to reveal a message or theme. A theme is not usually directly stated, but the reader can identify the theme by thinking about what the main character has learned. Another way to figure out the theme is by asking yourself, "What does this story tell about life?"

Theme: the lesson or message of the story.

**Decoding Skill:** Review Syllable Patterns V/CV: Divide the word before the consonant; the vowel has the long sound. VC/V: Divide the word after the consonant: the vowel has the short sound. **VC/CV**: Divide the word between the consonants: the first vowel has the short sound.
